

POOL MAINTENANCE

1. The Pool Maintenance Technician is responsible for the regular upkeep, cleaning, and repair of swimming pools and related equipment.
2. This role involves ensuring that pools are in optimal condition, adhering to safety and health standards, and providing excellent customer service.
3. Skim the pool surface to remove debris, leaves, and insects.
4. Empty skimmer and pump baskets to ensure proper flow and filtration.
5. Perform regular cleaning tasks such as skimming, vacuuming, and brushing pool surfaces to remove debris and algae.
6. Test and balance pool water chemistry, including pH, chlorine, alkalinity, and other chemical levels.
7. Adjust chemicals as needed to ensure water quality and safety.
8. Inspect and maintain pool equipment, including filters, pumps, heaters, and motors.
9. Troubleshoot and repair or replace faulty equipment.
10. Prepare pools for seasonal changes, including winterization and opening procedures.
11. Adhere to safety regulations and guidelines to ensure a safe environment for pool users.
12. Report any safety hazards or issues promptly.
