POOL MAINTENANCE

- 1. The Pool Maintenance Technician is responsible for the regular upkeep, cleaning, and repair of swimming pools and related equipment.
- 2. This role involves ensuring that pools are in optimal condition, adhering to safety and health standards, and providing excellent customer service.
- 3. Skim the pool surface to remove debris, leaves, and insects.
- 4. Empty skimmer and pump baskets to ensure proper flow and filtration.
- 5. Perform regular cleaning tasks such as skimming, vacuuming, and brushing pool surfaces to remove debris and algae.
- 6. Test and balance pool water chemistry, including pH, chlorine, alkalinity, and other chemical levels.
- 7. Adjust chemicals as needed to ensure water quality and safety.
- 8. Inspect and maintain pool equipment, including filters, pumps, heaters, and motors.
- 9. Troubleshoot and repair or replace faulty equipment.
- 10. Prepare pools for seasonal changes, including winterization and opening procedures.
- 11. Adhere to safety regulations and guidelines to ensure a safe environment for pool users.
- 12. Report any safety hazards or issues promptly.
- 13. Communicate with clients to address their concerns, provide updates on pool conditions, and offer recommendations for improvements or repairs.
- 14. Maintain accurate records of service activities, chemical levels, equipment repairs, and inventory of supplies.
- 15. Respond to and resolve emergency situations such as equipment failures, leaks, or water contamination.
- 16. Maintain cleanliness and organization of maintenance equipment and storage areas.
- 17. Ensure that all tools and equipment are properly maintained and stored when not in use.
